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

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

A teenager from <u>Melton</u> fell to his death from an abandoned hotel which had become a haven for 'urban explorers,' an inquest has heard.

Thomas Rhodes, a <u>university student</u> from Quorn Avenue, in Melton, was found dead at the front of the dilapidated building near to a fire hose which had been draped down from a height.


Concerns had been raised that intruders had gone to "extreme lengths" to access the building, including using ropes and the fire hose, an inquest heard.



Thomas, a first-year Sheffield University Geography student, fell to his death on Mother's Day, March 26 last year.

His death prompted the owners of Hallam Tower in Sheffield, South Yorkshire, to plead with Privacy an explorers' to stay away from the building for their own safety.

24 hour security - at a cost of £12 per hour per worker - had been advised to be introduced at the site which had laid derelict for 10 years.

Sheffield City Council had urged the owners of the building to properly secure the site to avoid intruders breaking in after receiving "multiple" reports from residents.

The fire service also had to break down a secure gate after arsonists torched a section of the building.

Gravel had been piled against a doorway and gates were reinforced to secure the site, an inquest heard.

Six days prior to Thomas' death, a local resident sent an email and photograph to the council of a fire hose hanging out of a first-floor window.

Stephen Exley from Sheffield City Council told an inquest: "I was obviously shocked, I would still say any building is not intrinsically dangerous, but the owners had secured it to a reasonable level.

"We are a reactive service. The fire hoses were used to get out of the building rather than getting in."

He added: "We have powers to issue notices. If you don't do anything in 48 hours we can come and secure the building.

"There was not an easy access. It would appear from the end of 2012 it was relatively quiet until 2016.

"There was a report in May, a report in June and a further report in August."

Julian Arnell, a building surveyor, argued that a 'local newspaper article' which included a link to a YouTube video "glorified" breaking into the site as an adventure sport.

He said: "Where Thomas was found was at the far end of the building. A fire hose had been draped down from an elevation.

"Everytime we identified an area where someone was getting in, it was dealt with."

"That made them more determined to find another way, they took more risks to get in.

"You are cut between a rock and a hard place, all you can do is respond to reports and get the situation dealt with as soon as possible.

"It was just an ongoing situation that you were managing as well as could be."

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A Chinese 'Rooftopper' Has Fallen to His Death While Scaling a Skyscraper

Chinese climber famous for scaling skyscrapers without any safety equipment has died after falling from a 62-story building in the city of Changsha, according to his girlfriend.

The 26-year-old daredevil, Wu Yongning, fell more than a month ago on Nov. 8, but his death was only recently confirmed by his girlfriend, according to the BBC.

After dabbling in television and film, Wu was drawn to the more lucrative endeavor of "rooftopping," where he could put his martial arts training to use, the BBC reports.

Rooftopping, the feat of climbing high-rise buildings to take photos or perform stunts at the top, has become an increasingly popular pastime after several viral videos. The practice evolved out of the urban explorer movement, also known as "urbex." It's not unheard of for rooftoppers to fall to their deaths.

Wu gained a large following on the Chinese social media network Weibo — he has more than 60,000 followers at time of writing — where he had posted hundreds of photos and videos of himself atop buildings he successfully scaled. His followers began to worry when he stopped posting updates in November.

At the time of his fall, Wu was attempting a rooftopping challenge in Changsha, the capital of Hunan province, hoping to claim the 100,000 yuan (\$15,000 USD) prize, according to the South China Morning *Post*.

His girlfriend reportedly called the police on Nov. 9 after he did not return

Before his fall, Wu's Weibo videos had warned viewers not to attempt his stunts.

Photographer, 30, Dies After Being Swept Away by Flood Waters While Taking Photos in Storm Drain

Rebecca Bunting and her boyfriend were taking photos in a Philadelphia storm drain on Saturday when the woman was fatally swept away during a flash flood

Friends of a beloved Philadelphia photographer are mourning the woman's death after she was fatally swept away in a storm drain during a flash flood last weekend.

Rebecca Bunting, 30, and her boyfriend were inside a sewer by Roosevelt Boulevard in Northeast Philadelphia taking photos around 6 p.m. on Saturday, June 2, when a rush of water came through and dragged them both down the system, police say.

The man was able to pull himself out, but Bunting was swept away. A neighbor told 6 ABC that he heard a man screaming for help Saturday night. He said he ran outside to find Bunting's boyfriend screaming her name by the water.

A rescue team found her body around 10:45 a.m. on Sunday, trapped under furniture left in Pennypack Creek near Philadelphia's Holmesburg neighborhood. In the wake of the death, Bunting's boyfriend remembered her in a pair of Instagram posts.

"I'm glad I got to make so many memories with her. I love you so much Becca and I'm hurting so bad right now," he wrote alongside a photo of the two posing together with wide smiles.

"Thinking back on all these memories makes me smile while these tears roll down my face. I will continue to share our memories since we had so many great ones. Please watch over your family and I, we really need it right now my love."

Police say Bunting and her boyfriend entered the storm drain without permission to take part in "Urban Exploration," in which they film their experiences while taking photos and footage at often abandoned locations.



2016-04-10

Please see below, in relation to the incident this evening, received from site, the CCTV system footage is available and clearly shows the offenders.

"At about 19:07hrs on 10/04/2016, two male young adults jumped over the Hera's fence opposite gate 5 onto the Tawer side of the site.

This incident was captured by a rotating camera and security reacted pretty quickly by following them and calling police simultaneously.

One security went in by gate 7 and the other by gate 8 and cornered the intruder in the Tawer and brought them to the security reception awaiting the police who arrived almost shortly.

These intruder had on them a professional camera and a video recorder. They claimed their intention was to go to the top of the Tawer and take photographs and make vodeo.

Their identity profiles are as follows:

Ruly Yoen, DOB- 14/02/1997

Address- 87 Spring Close, RM8 1SR

Ali Muhammed Hussain, DOB- 12/09/1996

Address- 83 Manor Road, E10 7HN.

The police let them go after a verbal warning and their details taken.

It is important to recognise that the site is exposed by the height of the Hera's fence at that particular spot. Video footage of the incident is forwarded herein."

2016-12-31

At about 17:40hrs today, the 31st of December, 2016, security saw boys jumping in from gate 7, before they could reach gate 7 via the new site entrance, the boys were already in.

Two security guards went in to search for them, the Guard at the Centre Point residence was called to support. As they were searching for the boys, the security at the reception watching the CCTV called the police.

About twenty minutes or so the Guards cornered the intruders in the tower and brought them to the security reception and almost simultaneously the police arrived. They were 14 and 15 year old boys. They had taken a few photographs.

The police interrogated them, took their details and they were asked to delete the pictures they had taken. The police warned them not to trespass again or come back here and asked them to go.

Please, find two pictures of the police talking to the boys. This is for your kind attention, please.

2017-01-02

At about 20:40hrs today, the 2nd of January, 2017, security on patrol saw two boys from the underground jumping in from gate 6, he quickly alerted the other Guards but the boys had ran into the tower.

Every effort to find them was futile. Police was called at 20:45. However, the intruders were seen from the outside climbing the stairs up the tower. While they were going they were seen taking pictures. We were also in touch with Phoenix Security Control and mobile team.

Eventually we strongly believed they were going to the top, while one was watching them two Guards went to the roof via the hoist and waited for them. It wasn't long before the two intruders walked up to the roof and met the Guards waiting for them and the security brought them down by the hoist to the security reception.

The police didn't come for 45 minutes and security searched them, recorded their details from their driving licence. The pictures they had taken were all deleted and security let them go. Find attached the photos of the boys and their details are as follows:

COWARD, ALEXANDER JAMES DOB - 07/05/1993

GORDON, JACK LEE DOB - 08/05/1992

2017-07-08

At about 04:00:14 hours of today, 08/07/2017, three white males, about the ages of 25 and 30 jumped in on site at Earnshaw street. Security saw them, quickly went to block them from the inside before they could gain access to the building.

On approaching to enter the building, they saw two security and security told them not to run or jump back onto the road for their own safety but one of them clearly of eastern European accent persuaded them to run quickly otherwise they will be handed over to the police. They all took to their heels, jumped off the site the way they came and ran towards St. Giles street and disappeared.

However, as that was going on, the night manager was informed, he came immediately. Security reviewed the three only functioning cameras, one captured part of the incident and that clip is herein forwarded for your kind attention, please.

At about 17:53 hours on 07/10/2017, two men with rucksack each on their back jumped in on site by gate 7. These men were seen by Security on patrol five minutes earlier at the Center Point Residence entrance area looking at the bin door but were asked to leave by Security.

They went via Earnshaw Street into New Oxford Street and jumped in near gate 7 and the Security on the CCTV alerted everyone. The intruders went straight into the Tower. Security called the police and they arrived in five minutes.

Security and the Police went into the Tower looking for them. Two Security Guards and two Policemen went to the roof via the hoist while another two Security Guards and two Policemen were in the Tower searching.

While at the roof the police said they could not get into the roof because it was not safe for them. The police decided to make their way down via the steps from 33rd floor checking the floors as they were coming down. Security made a brief search on the roof, found nothing and went down via the hoist to the ground.

For about an hour this was going on, Security stayed in the yard waiting while the police were in the building. About 19:04 hours the intruders came out from the Tower the same way they went in and were intercepted by the Security. They claimed to have gone to the roof to take pictures and make video recordings of the city.

One was aggressive, he had a GoPro camera on his head. He forced his way through the Heras fence and ran away on realising Security was calling the police. The police in the building came out and briefly detained the intruder that didn't run. He was searched and all on him in the rucksack were his stuff. His name was David Wallace. The police took his details and cautioned him.

The police concluded it was trespass and let him go. The email on his business card was DavidWallaceShoots@gmail.com, his Instagram account on the card reads DavidWallaceShoots.com.

The man who ran was with the camera they recorded on the roof. Security asked the police to request them to delete any pictures/videos taken on the roof. We are not certain they will do this. The police gave Security their email (Simon.King@met.pnn.police.uk) in the event any issues came out of the pictures/videos they made.

- 3. **DESCRIPTION OF THE INCIDENT:** At 22:42 three young males entered St Giles High Street and approached the Centre Point House entrance (see fig 1). Their presence had caught the attention of the Security Supervisor who had observed them from the Ops Room. A few seconds later the youths made their way toward the site perimeter and began to squeeze themselves between the fencing and the building wall. This area is just out of sight of the CCTV however, as the first intruder began to emerge on the inside of the perimeter hoarding he came into view of camera 12 and the security supervisor crashed the QRF as well as putting all security on high alert. The intruders struggled to get past the perimeter fencing and their relaxed nature implies they were unaware of being watched. The QRF made their way around the building via Earnshaw Street and to the breach location only a few seconds after the intruders had accomplished getting their third person inside. The on-scene guard shouted to the intruders who then began to run North along the footpath. At the Northern end of the footpath the youths then scaled the fence on the left hand side leading into the construction yard. Hastily trying to find an exit they made the natural choice of the delivery gate unaware there was a guard stationed at that location who was being updated of the culprit's movements and was awaiting their arrival. As they arrived at the delivery gate the intruders were confronted by the guard. 2 of the intruders quickly scaled the fence and made their escape by running past the guard and along New Oxford Street. The third male when confronted stopped his ascent of the hoarding and began to plea with the security. Once joined by the other available guards the situation was now under control and a security guard entered the delivery gate to help contain the intruder. There was a short period of questioning from the guard but as the intruder was informed that the police would be called he panicked and began to run again. His new chosen route was South through the site and over the fence at the same point of entry. There were no further siting's.
- 4. **FOLLOW ON ACTIONS:** The site was searched by the remaining guards who then returned to their duties while a brief situation report was sent to the Security Consultant along with short video images taken from the Ops room monitor. The Consultant was given a full brief from the supervisor upon his arrival and reviewed the video footage to assess the actions and responses of the manned guard. The on-scene guards were questioned to ascertain a description of the 3 assailants (see fig 3) and reports were formed. The actions and responses of the guard were put to the supervisor and ways to improve a repeat situation were discussed. A phoenix manager arrived on site on the morning of the 22nd March 18 and was given a full brief by the Security Consultant. The site management were also briefed and a meeting between the Consultant and the Concierge Manager was held to give an update of the situation and look at possible ways to combine efforts in the future.



5. **RECOMMENDATIONS/LESSONS LEARNT:** The total time between perimeter breach and a guard challenging the intruders was 72 Seconds. This is a good reaction time and the team have been commended as such. The follow-on actions and command and control of the situation were of a good standard. Points raised with the supervisor were the possibility of leaving a guard at the breach location to secure the site and the improvement of updates over the radio from the Ops Room. Over all the objective was achieved with a good standard of professionalism displayed by all parties. No injuries were obtained by either side and the intruders were removed from the site. The speedy interception of the intruders and their inability to escape easily will hopefully prevent them from trying to unlawfully enter the Centre Point location in the future.

Our team had intercepted both attempts and escorted them off of the premises, however this has highlighted some weak points with which we need to sort out, one of which is the Arcade access doors, as the first attempt was through their premises and into ours. I have a meeting with Thierry this afternoon to discuss this and put in a preventative measure.

The second attempt was directly through our ground floor NE doors (the ones which we have constantly had locking problems on), and this group literally just forced the door open. We will be reporting this to MPX as the defect has clearly not been fixed, however I will also be securing this door until this is fixed with a fire emergency management plan attached until its is resolved.

This is a testament to our team for stopping both of these attempts and I am very glad were did not end up in the Sunday papers.






Plan 1 - 22 Bishopsgate

ACTION TAKEN

Around 17:05 7 teenagers entered the CPH via residents entrance by following the resident, who left the building, they followed the fire escape routes and were spotted going up the North staircase via Mezz level, where they were spotted first. 5 of them were chased by Security and escorted out at around 17:25.

We were not aware that 2 intruders managed to stay behind and further investigations showed that they managed to got on top of the Lift #1 car top inside the lift shaft on level 9N by opening the lift shaft doors manually. This was the only lift lobby with failed access control, which they managed to access. Later we can see them coming out of the lift shaft from the top of the car lift on Level 33N. How they operated the lift is still under investigation.

Later around 17:35 we noticed them running through the car park from NE doors to Lift #1. They came through the same way as 30 minutes before. They called the lift #1 from the basement, went inside the lift, doors closed and the 2 remaining intruders called the lift from Level 33N, so that it took them up without the access control card.

By the time Security and Dan (GM) reached the top floor, the intruders already managed to get out to the roof through the half-open hatch. They allegetly damaged to metal cover, broke and disconnected a fw cables from the hatch and forced it open.

I called Police again and informed them that we have about 10 teenagers broke out to the roof. 2 officers arrived and I escorted them up where they took over. Dan stayed with them. Police called the helicopter to infra-red / thermo scan the roof and confirmed that no one was left on the roof.

When Police arrived part of the intruders managed to force open the South roof hatch and escape. They left via faulty access control to the PH lobby - lift #4 to basement - car park and out.

After the event the North roof hatch was successfully closed and secured. The South hatch didn't close by the key, as it was open almost flat out. Barriers were put in pace and Jaguar repaired and secured the hatch on Saturday 09/01/22.

Police took the details of some intruders and we are expecting their report.

Further investigations shows that supposedly there were 4 known urban climbers in London amongst the group of 11 people. CCTV images available and sent to Police accordingly.

We immediately identified the were intruders and requested to know who they are and what their purpose was. They ignored us and left the building via the reception revolving door.												
ACTION TAKEN												
As soon as they left, we started investigating how they accessed the building. We established through the CCTV that at approximately 18:14, the 4 males were waiting outside Centre Point House and pressing the buzzer in the hope that someone will open the entrance door for them. A resident opened the door for them, and they entered through Centre Point House entrance and made their way through the lobby to the fire door on Centre Point Level 2 North side.												
Once they gained entrance into level 2 North Side lobby, they forced the double doors open and somehow opened RO3 BOH doors and entered Kajima. Once inside Kajima, they made their way through to the Fire Door linking RO3 to the club and pressed the release button to access the club at approximately 18:43hrs. They then made their way to the North roof hatch through the stairs.
